CHANGES AND GROWTH

As you know from the September Newsletter, La Escuelita is getting ready to grow. After some changes in the Ministry of Education requirements and some earthquake damage, La Escuelita was able to offer only pre-school classes in 2015; and that will continue in 2016. However, with help from people like **YOU**, ambitious plans are underway!

Following requirements of the Ministry of Education, the engineering studies are done, the architectural drawings are complete, and the work has begun on the second floor! This addition will allow La Escuelita not only to go back to offering first and second grade, but to expand to the third grade as well.

Work will stop when classes begin in February and begin again at the end of the school year in December, 2016, and will be completed by the time the 2017 school year begins. In addition to the regular operating funds, you may also give specifically for this new construction. 2016 REGISTRATION


The 2016 school year will begin on February 8, but already children are being registered at a rate much faster than recent years. By the first of January, there were already 28 students registered. We expect about 80 students registered by the beginning of the academic year that **YOUR** gifts will help.

WHAT'S SO SPECIAL ABOUT THIRD GRADE?

Reading - That's What!

In the US we think about the milestone of a highschool education. But in a country like Nicaragua, a much smaller percentage of people ever get that far. Instead, the Nicaraguan Ministry of Education talks about the "battles" - the battle for the 9th grade, 6th grade, and 3rd grade.

Third grade is an important point in early childhood education, especially in a poverty-ridden area like the neighborhood around La Escuelita, where most children are not likely ever to get to high school or beyond. Educators know that students who have discovered a love for reading by third grade are much more likely to retain and build on this knowledge throughout their lives.



The teachers have always tried to instill a love of learning in their children, and through their university training they have learned how important the third grade is. Therefore they are planning for the enlarged building to include third grade. With **YOUR** help they will accomplish this goal.

The 19th Annual Graduation was held on the First of December, a little later than usual because all schools were closed for a few weeks when there was earthquake danger. Many happy children and proud parents were there, and many former students returned to watch their siblings graduate.
